La literatura latinoamericana tiene una rica tradición que se remonta muchos siglos atrás. La misma que aumentó a nivel mundial a lo largo de la segunda mitad del siglo XX. Durante el boom latinoamericano, trabajaron un grupo de novelistas cuyas obras circularon ampliamente en Europa y en todo el mundo. La exhibición de la Biblioteca Pública de Port Washington muestra a los escritores hispanos más influyentes de la historia, incluidos los seis ganadores del Premio Nobel de Literatura de Chile, Colombia, Guatemala, México, Perú y España.

Latin American literature has a rich literary tradition that dates back many centuries. It rose globally throughout the second half of the 20th century during the Latin American Boom, a literary movement when the work of a group of Latin American novelists became widely circulated in Europe and throughout the world. The Port Washington Public Library's exhibit showcases history's most influential Hispanic writers, including six of the eleven notable Hispanic Literature Nobel Prize winners from Chile, Colombia, Guatemala, Mexico, Peru, and Spain.

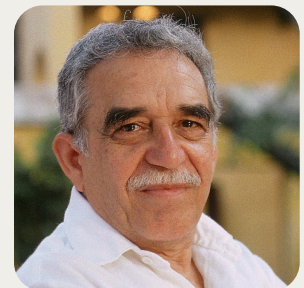

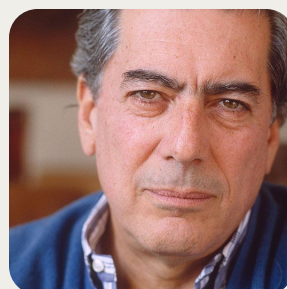

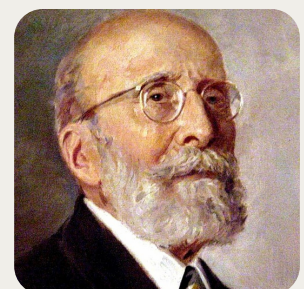
